



NATIVE PLANTS

Native plants are plants which were growing in this region prior to European settlement. For many years they have grown in this area without assistance from man. They are accustomed to our climate: the seasonal temperatures, seasons of additional rainfall, humidity, and drought.

Once established, they require little or no irrigation or fertilization and they are usually more resistant to pest and disease. As with all plants, the appropriate micro-climate in your yard needs to be considered when making your plant selections: shade, sun, wind, or salt conditions. Finally, native plants benefit the South Carolina ecosystem by providing shelter and food for wildlife.
